High School Programme

Child Safety

We provide your child with a dedicated advisor & mentor who will guide and support them throughout their experience. Your child will receive a letter from their mentor prior to arrival in their welcome pack and meet them on their first day at orientation.

Learning English

We offer complimentary weekly English classes in our centrally located language schools. These classes have proven successful in the past, not least for student's contributing language to acquisition but also as a social outlet for your child to catch up and check-in with other participants and their mentor.



Excellent Choice

We offer expert advice & assistance in the right school for your finding requirements. We provide a hand-picked selection of at least three schools to choose from based on your individual child's hobbies and interests to ensure they gain the best experience possible from their time in Ireland.



Friendly Families

We select our friendly host families for the welcome and care they will provide. All our families are recruited and inspected by ELI staff and have passed Police checks. We prioritize families with children of the same age.



Monitor & Report

We closely monitor and send regular reports on each student's progress throughout their time with us. We maintain regular contact with schools and host families to gain external feedback, and we attend all official parent and teacher meetings.

Guardianship

We pride ourselves on implementing the highest levels of guardianship, protection & monitoring standards to ensure every child is provided the best quality care.

Students face many challenges when studying abroad including homesickness, cultural differences and language difficulties. For many this is their first experience away from home and it is critical that parents choose the right programme for their child. Our Host Families

Sports & Hobbies



Types of School in Ireland

There are various types of school in Ireland, with options to suit all requirements. You will find school categories below and what to expect from each in the description.









Private Schools - EU & Non-EU Students

Private schools can welcome students from all over the world, including Non-EU countries. Our partner private schools include mixed and single gender schools, along with boarding or day schools staying with a host family.



State Schools - EU Students Only

State Schools in Ireland are funded by the Irish government. Some of the older schools were originally founded by religious orders although all new schools are funded by the government and are usually coeducational or mixed gender.




Mixed (CO-ED) & Single Gender Schools

Although a growing number of Irish parents are choosing mixed schools as a truer reflection of society, single gender schools still perform better in terms of the number of students progressing to university. Out of the top 40 schools in Ireland, just 20% are mixed. Of-course this does not mean that single gender schools provide a better education as a rule, but it is worth remembering when choosing a school. Often international students can be cautious about single gender schools as they aren't familiar with them, but in Ireland they are very common and they offer a fantastic option for this type of programme.

The Irish Education System

The Irish school system is split into two cycles called the Junior Cycle & Senior Cycle completed over a 5 or 6 year period usually from age 12 to 18. Below you will find a guideline as to the age range within each year group. However, this is not definitive and does not necessarily determine the year group your child can enroll in. It is simply a guide for your reference. We will always do our very best to facilitate your child's enrolment in the year best suited to them based on their educational history.

Senior Cycle

The Senior Cycle consists of two or three years depending on whether students take the optional year 4 which is called Transition Year (TY). Transition Year offers students a variety of new educational experiences where students are encouraged to try new subjects and to grow and develop both personally and academically. There are no formal exams in TY so students are under less pressure and can explore and expand their horizons, which can in turn help them make better decisions about which subjects to pursue in their final years and beyond. TY also includes a period of work experience and other opportunities to improve practical life skills. The final two years of the senior cycle are year 5 & 6 which culminate in the final state examination called the Leaving Certificate. Students take three core subjects and specialize in three or four elective subjects.

Holiday & Mid-Term Breaks

Whilst our goal is to ensure that your child has the most memorable high school year possible, experience would lead us to recommend that students return home for the Christmas holidays.

Although an exciting prospect to experience Christmas in another country, we have found that when the time comes, Christmas really is a time for students to be with their own natural family as no experience will match being home on Christmas morning. It is a time for families to be together and also a natural half-way point in the high school year to reconnect with your child. If your son or daughter wishes to stay in Ireland during the holidays, we can arrange a welcoming host family for them if necessary. For all other school holidays such as mid-term break and Easter, we run an engaging social programme facilitated by ELI staff to allow students to travel a little further afield!





Cambridge Exams

We invite all high school students to participate in complimentary English classes every week. For Dublin based students, lessons take place in our city centre language school every Wednesday afternoon from 5 - 6.30pm. For students in boarding school or attending schools outside of Dublin, we offer online access which allows all students the opportunity to prepare and potentially sit a Cambridge exam whilst in Ireland.

For students who do not wish to sit a Cambridge exam, this class can act as a learning support to them as it will have a grammatical element whilst assisting in the development of your childs pronunciation skills and improving their vocabulary and written ability.



In addition to language support, weekly attendance at ELI also affords your child the opportunity to link in with their ELI mentor on a casual basis. Should students wish to speak with their advisor or another member of staff on a more discreet level, this can of course be facilitated any time. We have found that with this weekly contact, a sense of reassurance is instilled in students whereby they feel content and comfortable to speak about every day events. This in itself can act as a counselling service and preventative measure for what one might consider a minor issue to escalate




ELI Dublin

The first step of the application process is to send us a short candidate profile. This should include the name, age & date of birth and any interests or hobbies or other relevant information. We will then suggest 2-3 school options that we feel match the requirements. Once students, parents and agents are happy to proceed a full application must be sent which should include:

- Completed application form.
- Copy of student's passport or birth certificate.
- Health certificate a letter from a doctor outlining any medical issues or prescribed medication.
- Recent school reports (2 years) original copy and a copy translated into English. This document does not need to be professionally translated. It just needs to indicate clearly the subjects taken and an indication of the high low marking scheme. It should be easy to read and understand so that it can be presented to the school principal for approval.

Confirmation of Place

Places in schools are typically confirmed in the weeks after the Easter holidays, although we will be able to give a strong indication of availability prior to this.

Students and parents should note that if applying after Easter many of the more popular school choices may be full. However, we will always be able to find a suitable school for your needs.

Once the school place has been confirmed we will supply confirmation documents including acceptance letters, book lists & uniform requirements, and school calendars. For state schools these documents are typically available in the weeks after the end of the academic year in June.

Once flight information has been received, we will send a detailed host family profile along with your dedicated advisor. We aim to send these documents a full 6 weeks prior to arrival.
